**Eynsford Concert Band**

Eynsford Concert Band is a youth community wind band based in Eynsford in Kent, a small village in the Darenth Valley to the north of Sevenoaks. It has recently celebrated its tenth anniversary having been formed in late 1972 due to a local need for an outlet for young wind and brass beginners who were taking lessons but had no group with which to play. The first rehearsals attracted only six or seven players but the numbers gradually progressed and now the band attracts members from a wide area of North Kent and South-East London. In 1979 Eynsford Concert Band made a very successful visit to Hanover in West Germany and was immediately invited to return which it did in 1982. It has also arranged several intensive courses with several leading players from the London Philharmonic Orchestra acting as tutors. The band has appeared twice at the Queen Elizabeth Hall, London, and also played on the BBC TV programme *Nationwide*. In 1981 an LP recording of the band was made at Rodean School, Sussex. Future plans include a tour to Philadelphia in 1984 and two joint concerts with the London Philharmonic Orchestra at the Royal Albert Hall at Christmas 1984.

**Robin O'Connell (conductor - Eynsford Concert Band)**

Robin O'Connell is the musical director of the Eynsford Concert Band which he founded in 1972. He is a trombonist and has been responsible for the development of the band to date. His early policy was to advance the standard by regularly entering the band for local competitive music festivals which have been adjudicated by distinguished musicians such as Lady Barbirolli and Vera Kantrovitch.

**Crayford Brass Band**

Crayford Brass Band was formed in 1963 by the combination of three bands: British Insulated Callanders & Cables (Charlton), Erith & Dartford Silver and British Legion Band (Erith). Erith & Dartford had previously been a trophy holder at the National Finals (Third Place - Second Section). Previous conductors have included Paul Fenelagh, Lt. Col. S Victor Harris and most recently, Fred Peddler. Crayford draws its players from South-East London and North West Kent. They will be entering the Second Section of the Lewisham Brass Band Contest in February.

**John G Pritchard (conductor - Crayford Brass Band)**

John G Pritchard served in the Royal Artillery after which he attended the Royal College of Music. After playing Bass Trombone as guest with the Halle, he joined the London Philharmonic Orchestra where he stayed ten years. In that time he played with most of the great conductors and appeared with every leading London orchestra including the two opera houses. He was also a member of the London Trombone Quartet and the London Cornet and Sackbut Ensemble. After qualifying at Avery Hill, John is now a senior county brass teacher and has a close involvement with the County Youth Orchestra. He was a Chairman of Eynsford Concert Band for many years and is the founder and director of Dartford Schools Concert Wind Band.
