**Evnsford Concert Band** 

Eynsford Concert Band was founded in 1972. Though it has a relatively short history, the band has rapidly developed into a successful group of talented musicians. Since it began, the band has performed many hundreds of times in theatres, parks and gardens, at fetes, musical contests and festivals, locally, countrywide and while abroad on tour.

The band has also played with the London Philharmonic Orchestra in the Royal Albert Hall and performed several times at the Queen Elizabeth Hall on London's South Bank. The band has recorded two albums. The second, "By the Ford" was recorded at the end of an intensive course with the BBC Symphony Orchestra. The band tours extensively, regular tours in the UK and abroad. Past destinations have included Malta, Cyprus, Austria, Canada, Spain, Germany. Southern Ireland, the Netherlands and most recently a visit to Prague. The band has always been warmly welcomed and has performed to large audiences in each country.

The village of Eynsford in Kent serves as base for the band's ventures. Eynsford may seem little known, but should be thought of as a well kept secret as it is one of Kent's most beautiful and historic villages.

#### Paul Welch

Paul was born in Somerset and began his musical training at the age of 12 when he took up the trombone at school. Over the next five years he played with many concert bands and orchestras, including the Somerset County Youth and Senior Orchestras.

In 1969 Paul joined The Band of Her Majesty's Irish Guards and with them played in many European countries, as well as North and South America, Canada, Australia and many more. Having attained the rank of Band Sergeant Major he retired from the Army in 1993 and since then has been a publican. Paul with his wife Sheena and their daughter Sharon currently own and run The Three Horseshoes at Knockholt.

Teaching has been a large part of Paul's life and he particularly enjoyed his time at The Royal Society for the Blind School, Dorton House at Seal near Sevenoaks. He has also spent time as the European Programme Director for the "Bands of America" organisation, which involved bringing many high school and university bands to perform in Europe.
