Gina Beck

Gina Beck is an English actress and singer known primarily for her roles in leading musical theatre productions. Gina is currently starring as Christine Daaé in Cameron Mackintosh's production of *Andrew Lloyd Webber's The Phantom of the Opera* in London's West End.



Gina graduated in 2004 from The Central School of Speech and Drama in London, and since graduation she has had a number of small cameo roles on TV as well as doing voice-over work for English Language teaching tapes produced by Peason Education.

Gina performed in opera and operetta during 2005 at Holland Park Opera and the Buxton Opera House and in 2006 she toured South Africa in *The Merry Widow* as well as making her West End debut as Cosette in *Les Misérables* at the Queens Theatre, leaving after a year to create the lead role of Rebecca Warshowsky for the world première of the new musical *Imagine This* at the Theatre Royal, Plymouth in July 2007.

At Christmas time that year Gina appeared as Wendy Darling in the Rachel Kavanaugh production of *Stiles and Drewe's Peter Pan the Musical* at the Birmingham Rep.

Gina took over the principal role of Christine Daaé in *The Phantom of the Opera* at Her Majesty's Theatre in September 2008. Since that time she has also performed 'The Phantom of the Opera' duet with Ramin Karimloo at Andrew Lloyd Webber's 60th birthday concert in Hyde Park.

Every year the Band selects a charity to support by means of concerts and social events. To date the band has raised in excess of £20,000 and although we are a charity in our own right we are very proud that we still manage to give back time and money to many worthwhile causes. Spadework is an independent charity which undertakes tuition in a number of subject areas for adults with learning difficulties. For over a year I've had the privilege of being one of these volunteers and have experienced firsthand the invaluable work they undertake. This year is a big year for Spadework as it celebrates its 25th anniversary. To help them celebrate, we will be holding a special fund raising concert on Saturday 11th July at St. Nicholas Church, Sevenoaks. I will also be organising a number of social events during the year. The money raised will be used to provide a lasting benefit to Spadework.

I'm aware that 2009 is proving to be a difficult year for us all and many charities are suffering as a result. However, with your support we endeavour to make a valued contribution to this amazing charity.
